Q1. A 24 year old primigravida has come for antenatal checkup at 10 weeks of gestation. (15, 19)

- What are the aims of antenatal care? 15 T.T
- What investigations you will carry out at booking visit? Repeat 319 UMS 02

Q2. Mrs. B is admitted through emergency two hours after home delivery of her sixth child with profuse vaginal bleeding. Her blood pressure is 90/60 mm of Hg and pulse 110/min. She is conscious.

- What are the possible causes of post-partum haemorrhage for Mrs. B? (262) Repeat 02
- What are the pre-operative preparations for the manual removal of placenta under anaesthesia? 03

Q3. A 28 year old G4P3+0 with 39 weeks of pregnancy, comes to labour room with labour pains for 3 hours duration. She is 3 cm dilated when artificial rupture of membrane is done. You see grade 1 meconium. She has otherwise uncomplicated pregnancy with all previous vaginal deliveries.

- What can you do to assess the fetus in labour? B shape score 352 Q22 UMS 01
- How will you manage this case? (399 UMS) 04

Q4. A 36 year old primigravida is followed up at the health center & referred to the hospital antenatal clinic at 37 weeks of gestation. On abdominal examination, the size of uterus corresponds to dates & the head was not engaged but instead felt in the fundus with a longitudinal lie.

- What is the most likely presentation in this case? Extended breech 02
- What would you like to do before you allow the patient to deliver vaginally? Mention TWO. 93 T.T 02
- Mention the complications to this fetus that can occur during delivery. 42 T.T

Q5. A 26 year old primigravida presented at 34 weeks of gestation with complaint of headache. On examination, her pulse is 90/min BP 160/110 mm of Hg symphysiofundal height is 34 cm urine analysis shows 3+ albumin.

- What is your diagnosis? Pre-eclampsia (134) Repeat 01
- What investigations you will ask for? (375 UMS) 02
- How will you manage her? 02

Q6. A 28 year old G3P2+0 with previous vaginal deliveries, now presented at 12 weeks showing twin pregnancy.

- What are the ultrasound features for the diagnosis of chorionicity at this gestation? Mono chorionic → Dichran → bambasyn Repeat 02
- What are the complications associated with monochorionic twins? → TTTI (106) TAPS (373 UMS) 03

Q7. You are called out to evaluate a young lady delivered 02 days ago whom the family describes as Depressed. She is physically normal & has a healthy baby boy.

- What are the psychiatric ailments in puerperium? 362 UMS 02
- How would you manage this case? (284) (410 UMS) 03
