"Stages of labor"

Labour:

- Defined as the presence of strong regular painful contractions resulting in progressive cervical changes.
- Signs of labour:
- □Loss of show
- □ Spontaneous rupture of membranes

Three Stages of Labour:

First stage:

Time from start of labour till full dilatation of cervix (10cm).

1.Latent Phase:

From start of labour till 3-4 am cervical dilatation.

2. Active Phase:

Time between the end of latent phase (3-4 am) and full dilation (10 cm)of cervix.

BISHOPS SCORE IN INDUCTION

 Used to determine favorability / ripening of cervix in vaginal examination.

If high score Cervix favorable
Associated with an

easier shorter

If low score

Cervix unfavourable
Induction takes more
longer period & more
likely to fail
May ends in a
emergency LSCS.

Duration of first stage of labour:

- Average duration of 1st labour is 8 hours.
- © Cervical dilatation in active phase of labour is 1 am per hour.
- Average duration of labour in Multiparous (Subsequent labour) is 5 hours.
- ♦ 1st labour rarely lasts more than 18 hours.
- Second and Subsequent labour not more than 12 hours.

Second Stage:

Time from full dilatation of cervix to delivery of fetus.

- 1. Passive Stage
- 2. Active Second Stage

Duration of second stage of labour:

- \$2 hours ---- Nulliparous
- ◆1 hours ----- Multiparous

With Epidural Anesthesia second stage of labour prolonged to 1 hour.

Third stage of labour:

- Time from delivery of fetus until complete delivery of placenta
- **Duration**:

Placenta usually delivered within minutes of birth of baby.

If it is more than 30 minutes Abnormal 3rd stage of labour.

a) Pracipitous labour less than 3 hours

b) Prolong labour

longer than 12 hours in Nulliparous 8 hours in Multiparous.
